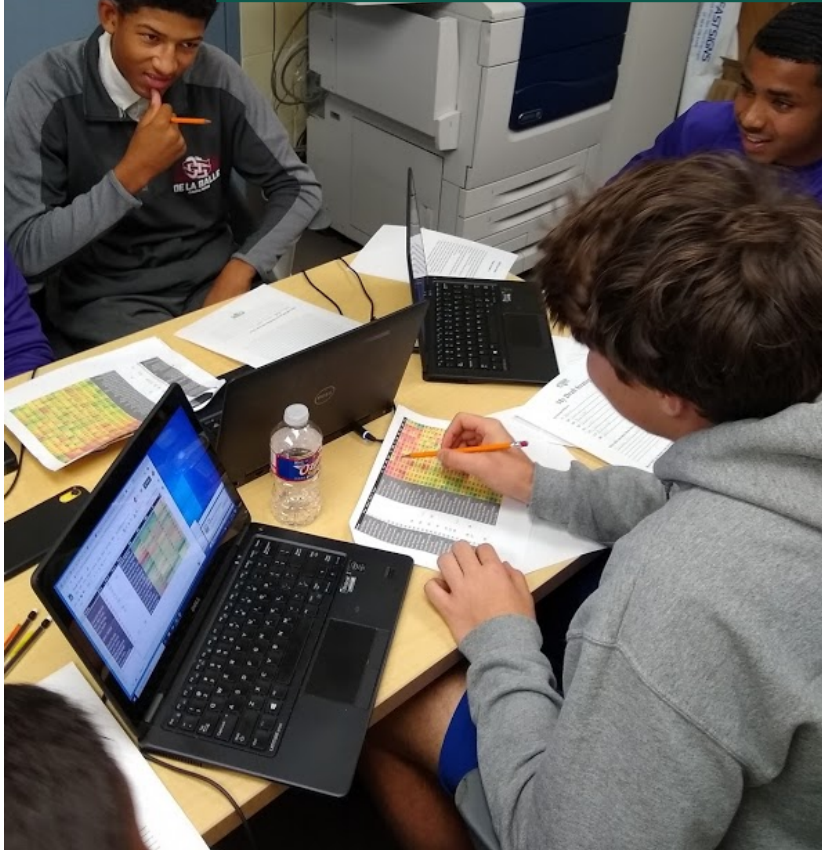

# THE PROGRAM

## Overview

The **Business and Legal Side of Baseball** educates students about statistical analysis, law, mathematics, computer science, and expands their academic and potential career horizons. Our online courses connect students with experts from Tulane University and their peers from youth academies across the country.

## Certificate Options

The **baseball analytics certificates** introduce students to an interdisciplinary curriculum consisting of statistics, mathematics, and computer science through baseball while engaging students in collaborative, STEM learning activities. Areas of focus include:

- Data Visualization
- Box Plots
- Player and Team Evaluation
- Scatter Plots

The **baseball law certificate** explores law through a humanities-focused curriculum and provides opportunities for students to develop literacy, public speaking, and debate skills. Areas of focus include:

- Trademark Law
- Copyright Law
- Image and Likeness
- Intellectual Property Law

## Certificate Session Details

Certificate sessions run June - July.

Baseball Analytics Certificates consist of 2 Saturday morning sessions (120 minutes each).

Baseball Law Certificates consist of 4 weekday sessions (60 minutes each).
